FOR THE PERIOD DEC 2022 TO NOV 2023

1. It gives me a great pleasure in sharing about NAF activities with the members, the report for the period December to October 2023.

Progress Report

- 2. **Annual Subscription** In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, annual subscription for Chapters was disturbed due to lack of adventure activities across the country. However as situations improved across the country, the decisions of last Executive Council meeting held on 11th Dec 2022, Chapters were required to pay normal subscriptions. Some chapters have paid Annual Subscriptions but some are still due. Similarly for this year i.e., 2023 too some chapters have not deposited subscription. It is important to note that subscriptions remain an important resource to carry out activities of the headquarters and create work for chapters and members. However, suggestions from members are welcome to expedite process.
- 3. Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
 - (a) FY 2022-23 There were no allotment for FY 2019-20, 2020-2021 & 2021-2022.
 - (b) Submission of Proposals for the Financial Year 2023-24 A meeting of President with Secretary, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports took place on 17 October 2023 on the pretext of a meeting on Formulation of Guidelines for Land and Water Adventure Sports. The meeting between President and Secretary Smt. Meeta R Lochan, Secretary (Youth Affairs), IAS was fruitful. The proposal for financial year 2023-24 was submitted online on 25th October 2023. On telephonic update with Mr. Dharmendra Kumar Yadav and his office, it was informed that Proposal for Grants-in-Aid under NPYAD Scheme of Ministry of Youth Affairs, Government of India has been submitted.
- 4. Publication of NAFER 2023 Last NAFER was published in the year 2020 and it was launched during AGM on November before I joined in December 2020. I have seen the dedication and commitment of the past Editor Col Sudhir Nagpal (Retd) for working tirelessly for the Annual issue of NAF. He has been so persistent in ensuring its standard and timely publications. This year, President instructed me to become Editor for NAFER. It was very challenging task for me. It was because of huge expectations from me as Col Nagpal sets in

the past. Now as NAFER 2023 has been published, I wish that I met the expectation of the people of NAF family.

- 5. Citizen Schemes NAF has continued to conduct programmes under these Schemes, the number of which had, relatively, gone down however the program is going on. A few details of the programmes conducted in this period are as follows:-
 - (a) AMITY Programmes. Amity Programmes have started from September 2023. Last year, Amity programmes were done for UG, PG and Schools students, Last year, 12 programmes have been done for UG students, 19 for PG students and 07 for Schools students. A total of 5242 students have been covered in last F.Y till 31st March 2023. Now from September onwards, 07 programmes have been done for PG students. A total of students have been covered.
 - (c) Corporate Training OBT. M/s Acme India had planned for OBT however the program could not be done because of Pandemic. An advance payment was received in 16 Mar 2021. I am in touch with their new manager for confirmation of fresh dates.
- NAF Activities and Events I am pleased to announce the programme NAF conducted during last year-
 - (a) Rajasthan Adventure Day On 14 Feb 2023, NAF conducted the One-day programme at various Chapters of NAF on the Third Death Anniversary of Shri Magan Bissa ji as Rajasthan Adventure Day (RAD). NAF Bikaner Chapter organised a day program on 14 Feb 2023 including a Blood Donation Camp along with some other Chapters like Mumbai, Jharkhand, UP-II etc. Various Chapter Directors from across India gave a tribute to Shri. Magan Bissa ji.
 - (b) National Adventure Day On the occasions of birth anniversary of our founder Brig Gyan Singh, NAF celebrate 12th April 2023 as National Adventure Day. Like last year NAF celebrated one-month long programme starting from 12 March to 12 April 2023 at various locations of NAF Chapters. These were organized by our Chapters with vigor and enthusiasm. On this occasion, NAF headquarters planned two events:-

- National Adventure Award 2022 Brig Gyan Singh National Adventure Award 2023 which was instituted from last year onwards, was organized this year too. We received a total of 10 entries/recommendations for the award. The Jury members of the Award are Ms Anuja Shegal, EC Member, Mrs. Archana Sardana, World renowned BASE jumper. The jury members did a great work and winners were decided. The final approval was given by the President, NAF. The winner of Brig Gyan Singh National Adventure Award for the year 2023 are Ms. Shivangee Rana in Female Category Mr. Rohitashwa Bissa & Mr. Ganesh Chandra Jena In Male Category. They will get a cash prize of Rs.10,000/-, a citation and a memento. The memento has been sponsored by Mr. Daya Mishra, Director Bihar Chapter.
- ii) NAF Social Media Post Competition This Social Media Post
